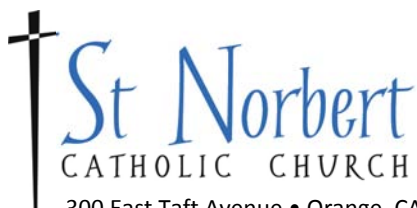

Isaiah 58:7-10

The Light of Charity

If you do good things for others, good things will be done for you. That simple promise comes from Isaiah's prophecy. Feed the hungry. Shelter the homeless. Clothe the naked. Then your wound will be healed.

Isaiah addresses people being freed from their oppression. He tells them to be mindful of the needy. Several weeks ago, we heard him promise that those who had dwelled in darkness would see a great light. Now he says that light is coming from a specific location. It will come from within. As God's chosen people, their light will shine. But they should not just sit and wait for it. Their light will shine when they act in kindness.

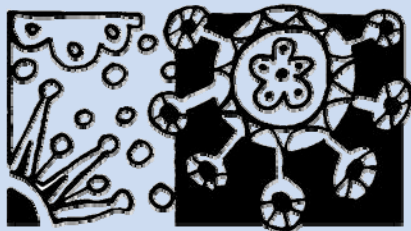
Food, shelter, and clothing are basic human needs. Without them, people cannot live. Isaiah expects that those who have will share with those who have not. If we do not, the world cannot live at peace.

Many parishes offer practical opportunities for this kind of charity. They support a food pantry. They collect clothing. They repair homes and help the needy pay their bills. God may be calling you to perform a very specific action to help someone overcome a very basic need. Let your light shine.

Wondering Why

While we sometimes think of the Prophets of Biblical times as foretelling the coming of Christ, and as Christians, we can see the messianic hopes of the Israelites fulfilled in Jesus, the primary role of the prophets was not looking into the future, but to call people back to God in their present time. The word "Prophet" comes from the Greek *pro-phetes*, which means to speak on behalf of someone else. The prophets spoke on behalf of God. These men, and sometimes women, recognized that Israel had departed from a faithful observance of the Covenant between their people and God, and warned them that the continuation of this unfaithful behavior would result in a loss of the covenant promises, land, children, and protection.

The two biggest themes, often repeated among all the prophets, were false worship and injustice. The covenant with God demanded the worship of the Lord, and the abandonment of all the gods of other peoples. It also demanded a fair and just society in which the needs of all would be met, and the community had a special obligation to care for its poor, the widow, the orphan, the elderly, and the ill. According to the scriptural accounts, the Israelite people fell short on both accounts. They lived among foreign tribes who worshipped many nature gods, and it was a

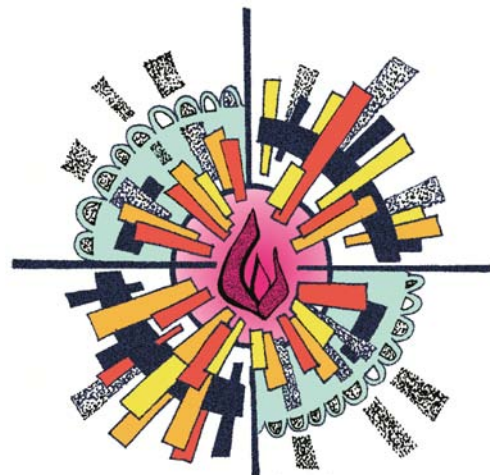
constant temptation to the people to follow the culture of their neighbors and participate in the idolatrous worship of these gods, especially at times when the other tribes seemed more prosperous or stronger than the Israelites were. In their quest for strength and prosperity, the Israelites would participate in the worship of these false gods. They had to continually be called back to fidelity.

The Israelites also faced temptation to neglect the neediest and most vulnerable among them. Although throughout the scriptures, God had repeatedly reminded them to form a society of justice and mutual support, like many peoples, they often fell into a "me-first" mentality and forgot their obligation to see to the needs of others. This problem is what Isaiah is addressing in the first reading today. Once again, he reminds the People of God that they are to share bread, clothing and shelter with those who are in need. Isaiah promises that those who do so will find their own blessings and their prayers will be heard.

In other passages, we hear that giving alms covers a multitude of sins. God, who hears the cry of the poor, as the psalmist writes, also takes notice of those who serve the poor.

Today many families are suffering losses of employment, investment income, property and security. The church helps them through many national, regional and parish programs. But in order for this work to be effective, all those who are able are called to seek out and find the best way to contribute or participate so that adequate resources can be made available to those in need.

The prophets wrote for their own time, but as God's word is eternal, their message is also for our time. It is easy for us to become distracted by the promises of our secular culture, and begin to put its values before that of true and faithful worship. It is easy to ignore the needs of others and put all our energy into getting what we may feel we want or deserve. Yet, Isaiah reminds us also, if we look first to God and the service of others, we shall receive abundant blessings in return.

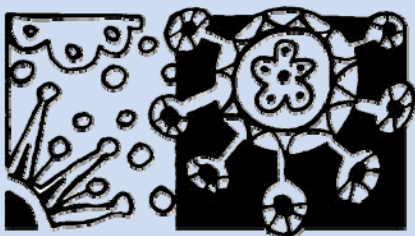
Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios

Los mismos corintios estaban tan satisfechos de sí mismos y tan orgullosos de sus propios dones que se les había olvidado quién se los había concedido y para qué eran sus dones. Pablo les recuerda a ellos y también nos recuerda a nosotros que todo lo que tenemos, incluso nuestra fe, viene del Señor y es para beneficio de los demás. Lo que brilla es la luz del Señor a través de aquellas personas que como Pablo ponen su confianza en Dios. Caminar en esa luz significa permitir que la generosidad, la misericordia y la justicia de Dios brillen a través de nosotros. Y eso significa también compartir todo lo que tenemos, personalmente y como comunidad, de la misma manera que Dios lo ha hecho y sigue haciéndolo por nosotros.

El documento del Concilio Vaticano Segundo sobre la Constitución Dogmática de la Iglesia se titula *Lumen Gentium*, o sea, "Luz de las Naciones", porque la Iglesia está llamada a ser precisamente eso. La luz de Cristo se nos da no sólo para nuestro propio beneficio en el presente, ni aún sólo para nuestra salvación futura, sino para que otras personas puedan "ver la luz" y dirijan su mirada y su vida hacia la alborada del Sol de Justicia: Cristo, nuestra Luz.

Beware of Telephone Scams

Across the country, law enforcement officials are warning seniors to beware of so-called "grandparent scams," in which fraudsters are impersonating a grandchild in distress—and begging for cash. The typical M.O.: "Grandma (or Grandpa), are you there?" a caller will say, prompting the senior to reveal a name or other identifying information. The caller then says they were in a car accident, mugged or incarcerated in a foreign country—all emergencies prompting an urgent need for cash.

Typically, the caller begs for secrecy, in order to prevent a quick phone call to the grandchild's parents to verify the story. When asked why their voice sounds funny, they'll usually claim they are upset, or their nose or mouth is injured. Once a victim wires money, more calls may follow, employing other callers who pose as attorneys, bail bondsmen or doctors.

Tips to protect against grandparent scams:

- Be suspicious of anyone who calls unexpectedly asking for cash.
- Verify any supposed emergency, by calling friends and family, before wiring money.
- Develop a secret code or "password" with family members that can be used to verify a true emergency.
- Limit personal information, such as vacation plans, shared on social media sites.
