Source of Happiness

Many of us think happiness comes from having money and spending it on possessions. The things of this world charm us. They bring joy to dreary days. But they have no permanence and they cannot bring eternal delight.



But some people go from friend to friend, from relationship to relationship, seeking something more. The best of friends are committed to friendship, and they learn the nature of love. True happiness comes from God alone. St. Paul had lived in the humblest of circumstances and he had enjoyed the abundant generosity of benefactors. He told the Philippians, "In every circumstance and in all things I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry, ... I can do all things in him who strengthens me."

All things—we can do all things in God who strengthens us. We can be rich or we can be poor. We can be alone or in the midst of others. We can be hungry or very well fed. But we can only be happy in God.



R.C.I.A.

This **Thursday, October 16**, Pete Moiarty will be talking to our Catechumens about the Mass and the Sacrament of Eucharist. The following week our topic will be on the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy and the virtues of Faith, Hope, and Love.

Anyone interested in beginning the process of becoming Catholic, or with questions about Catholic belief, is invited to come any Thursday at 7:30 p.m. to our Inquiry sessions. Inquiry is an open-ended small group discussion format designed to respond to questions or to begin a person's faith journey toward Catholic sacraments. Topics are determined by the interests expressed in the group.

Bible Studies

Monday Mornings: The morning group will meet this **Monday, October 13**, in the Ministry Center Library at 9:15. New participants are still welcome to join this overview of the whole Bible which will continue until Easter. Each session consists of a video presentation and discussion.

Prayer & Meditation with Scripture

Our prayer group will gather in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel this **Tuesday, October 14**. This hour of prayer time utilizes varying prayer forms each week. It is a time to meet with others in quiet and peace away from the busyness and noise of the world. We gather for prayer in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel at 7:30 p.m.

Wondering Why

Again, this week, we have another of Jesus' parables that can be puzzling. Remember that Jesus taught in the rabbinic style of parables, which were stories that were designed to draw the imagination and emotions of the hearer into a deeper understanding of the Kingdom of God. Today's parable comes

from the section of Matthew's Gospel near the end of Jesus' teachings, which is called the Discourse on Eschatology, or in simpler terms, instructions on the end times. In it, Jesus is telling a story to make a comparison to the final judgment.

The feast the king is planning in the parable is no ordinary party, it is a wedding feast. Throughout the Old Testament, God is frequently portrayed in a spousal relationship with Israel. In the New Testament Jesus is sometimes referred to as the Bridegroom. This wedding is about the end of time when God and his people will be joined together in an eternal covenant of love.

The first set of guests to be invited refuse to come. A second invitation is made to them, but the messengers who bring it are mistreated and killed. From Matthew's perspective, the first invited to God's Covenant of Love are the Jews. Throughout their history, they had often failed to be faithful to God's covenant. When Prophets were sent from God to correct them and invite them back into righteousness, which means being in the right relationships, those prophets are abused and sometimes murdered.

Then, the king in the story, sends his messengers out to the public roads to invite in whomever they find. In Matthew's world, this would symbolize the Gentiles, those people who were not Jewish, who had never received the promise of redemption. Because the invitation to come to the feast had been ignored or rejected by the Chosen Ones, the first invited, now it would be offered to the outsiders.

Perhaps the most peculiar part of this parable is that when these second-invited guests arrive, one of them is thrown out of the party because he is not dressed in appropriate clothes. This is odd, if the instructions were to go out to the roadways and invite whomever is found, how could these people be expected to be dressed for a wedding? To understand the meaning intended one must become familiar with a bit of Jewish culture of the 1st century. At a wedding, the host would provide fancy robes for the guests to wear. To refuse to put on the robe that the host provided would be a great insult.

So, this guest is excluded not because he didn't have anything nice to wear, but because he refused to dress himself in what was offered. In a Christian context, this wedding garment is the baptismal robe. In order to celebrate at the nuptial feast of God and his people, the invited guests must clothe themselves in Christ.

As we apply the parable to ourselves, we might ask what gets in our way personally of accepting God's invitation. Are we too busy, too distracted, too self-involved to respond to the invitation of God's love?

And, we could ask ourselves, what "old clothes," old habits, old opinions, old prejudices, old grudges do we need to take off and put aside in order to put on the wedding garment of Christ and come into the banquet?

Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios



A menudo se ha hecho la pregunta de lo qué pasaría si una mañana de domingo, mientras oramos como siempre lo hacemos para que Cristo vuelva de nuevo, él se presentara ante nosotros. ¿Iríamos a su fiesta? ¿O acaso preferiríamos nuestra pequeña reunión privada en vez de la enorme multitud de personas que en realidad no queremos conocer? ¿Nos encontraría con la vestidura de la fidelidad que se nos dio en el Bautismo? ¿Dónde estaríamos en “ese día”?




