
Reflecting on God's Word

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First apprentice, then journeyman, and finally master. That's the way someone "travels" when learning a trade. But before "setting out" one must find a trustworthy master who will accept him to study with her. Then he must commit himself to the "journey" of learning the trade. By watching and listening to the master, by imitating her example and following her advice, the disciple gradually learns her "ways."

The Scriptures this week present a journeyman, Jonah, and a master, Jesus. Why did people trust and follow them? People responded to Jonah because he was traveling the way of the Lord himself; he had repented and set out on the journey of discipleship. They responded to Jesus because he was a master worthy of their trust and because he invited them to be his disciples, to walk at his side and to study his ways. People followed them not because of their words, but because they knew the way.

PSA2015 Coming Soon

Last week we began our Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA) efforts here at St. Norbert which focused on the many ways we are *Living our Faith* in our parish, and throughout our Catholic Church in Orange. Next week we will show a DVD from our diocese which highlights the wonderful things we do as a community, for which we can be proud, and the amazing impact that we have within Orange County.

Our pledge weekend will be **February 7 and 8**. Funds raised in excess of our \$151,000 diocesan obligation will be used to pay down the loan on our Family & Youth Center, due within the next three years. Currently we owe **\$473,003** so we are not far from paying off that debt. Each family will be receiving more information about our PSA program this year, along with their pledge envelope, in the mail in the coming week or so. We hope you prayerfully consider your pledge.



St. Norbert Catholic School has partnered with **Cars 4 Causes**, the vehicle donation service known as the "Charity that gives to charities." Anyone with a functioning or non-functioning vehicle they no longer want—car, truck, RV, motorcycle or boat—can contact **Cars 4 Causes**. The organization handles the paperwork, picks up or tows the vehicle, makes repairs, sells the vehicle and provides the donor with a tax receipt. St. Norbert Catholic School will then receive a donation based on the final resale price of the vehicle.

The money earned from this program will be directed straight to our school's Endowment Fund, a perpetual fund that is predictable, reliable and prudent over time, providing a source of continuous support for our school outlined in a restricted gift agreement. The principal of this fund remains intact and interest earned will be allocated annually to the operating budget of our school, diminishing the deficit that exists between our income and ordinary expenses. Currently, we depend on fundraising to close that gap.

It is a time to meet with others in quiet and peace away from the busyness and noise of the world. You are all most welcome!

Wondering Why

Most people have heard the story of Jonah and the big fish that swallowed him that is told in the Old Testament, and from which we take our first reading this Sunday. This story is Biblical literature of the type that is called didactic fiction, or in terms that might sound more familiar, a parable. It is a story, not an historical incident, intended to teach, much the same as the parables that Jesus told during his lifetime.

While a prophet by the name of Jonah is mentioned in the book of Kings, nothing is known about the actual person. This story takes that prophetic figure and creates a parable around him. Jonah is a reluctant prophet. In the story, God calls him to go to Nineveh and announce God's message to the people living there. Jonah doesn't want to go. To the ancient Jews this would have been perfectly understandable. Nineveh was the capitol city of one of their major enemies, the Assyrians. Jonah believes that the people of Nineveh are so far removed from God that they will not listen to God's word and will probably kill his prophet. There is no hope for them, so why should he bother and put himself at risk as well, he reasons.

In order to escape the mission to which he is called, Jonah tries to run away, boarding a ship that is going in the opposite direction. This doesn't work out well for Jonah. A storm comes up and Jonah gets tossed into the sea. The big fish comes along and swallows Jonah up, only to vomit him back up on the beach of Nineveh three days later. This is one clue that the story is fictional, the actual Nineveh does not have any coastal territory.

In any case, Jonah is now exactly where he does not want to be, in the capitol city of his people's enemies. He does not believe that they will listen to his message from God, but since he has no alternative he goes out to preach. To his enormous surprise, the people listen to his message, repent and turn to God. The story tells us that even the animals of the city put on sackcloth and ashes (the symbols of repentance).

This story will have one more twist at the end. When a plant that has grown up and provided Jonah with shade in the hot dessert suddenly dies, Jonah becomes angry with God. God rebukes him by asking him how he could care so much about a plant which Jonah neither planted nor tended, and not understand why God would care about the people of Nineveh whom he has created.

Parables always have a message. This one has a number of important spiritual reminders. First, God may call us to do things we neither understand nor want to do, secondly, it is impossible to run away from God, and thirdly, no one is beyond grace. The last point is the most important because according to the story Jonah despairs of the Ninevites being open to God's word, and yet they overwhelmingly repent upon hearing God's invitation to them. It is a reminder to all people of all time that those whom we think may be farthest from God, might only be waiting to hear the invitation to come to him and may respond with more enthusiasm than we might ever have imagined.

Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios


Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

La gente le respondió a Jonás porque él iba por el camino del Señor, se había arrepentido y partió para hacer la travesía del discipulado. Le respondieron a Jesús porque él era el maestro digno de la confianza de ellos y porque los invitó a ser sus discípulos, a caminar junto a él y a estudiar su estilo de vida. La gente los siguió no por las palabras que ellos dijeron, sino porque conocían el camino.
