## Reflecting on God's Word

### Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Perhaps you saw the movie *The King's Speech* about the future king of England, George VI, whose speech impediment was so severe that it reduced him to tears of anger and humiliation. His wife, Elizabeth, found a speech therapist who was able to help him by using some unorthodox methods, such as rolling around on the floor, cursing, and singing. It is a profoundly moving experience when King George finally addresses his people over the radio and delivers a speech flawlessly, giving courage to his people on the eve of World War II.

The story in this Gospel tells us how Jesus helped a man to find his voice. The man whose tongue Jesus touched with his spittle (an element believed to ward off demons) came to speak "plainly." Another word for "plainly" would be "rightly," in the sense of correctly or truly. "Be opened!" Jesus says, and it happens (Mark 7:34). The man then spoke the truth of what Jesus did for him, and honored him.

As we hold firm to our faith in the Lord, Jesus calls us to both speak and act "rightly" in the eyes of the world, caring for those who have little and treating them with the same dignity as those who have much. We are called to imitate Jesus by reaching out tenderly to touch those who have been wounded by life and burdened by the rejection of others. Helping others to hear the sound of love can be done in many quiet ways and with little fanfare.

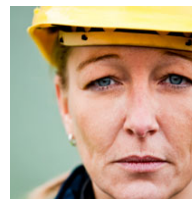

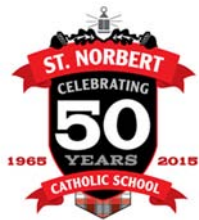
#### Back-to-School Night

## Faith Formation: Church History

The topics that evening will move into the Middle Ages and include *The Mendicants: Francis and Dominic*, and *Flower of Religious Art in the Middle Ages*. Join us on Wednesday evenings for an in depth study of the various centuries, ideas, and practices that have brought the Church from a confused and frightened group of twelve disciples to the largest religion in the world. We meet in the Ministry Center Library from 7:30 to 9 p.m.

## Beginners Introduction to the Bible

Beginning **Tuesday, September 15**, we will offer a 10-week *beginners* introduction to the Bible. This class is best for those wanting to get started reading Scripture who have not previously participated in a Bible Study group. We will talk about how to read and interpret the Scriptures, how to locate texts in the Bible, and the meanings of the stories found throughout the Scriptures. This study will begin with 5 weeks on the Old Testament, followed with 5 weeks on the New Testament beginning October 20. Parishioners are invited to participate in the whole study, or either section of it individually. This group will meet on Tuesday evenings from 7:30 to 9 p.m. in the Ministry Center Library. There are no costs associated with this study.

## Monday Morning Bible Study

We will be studying the Gospel of Matthew this fall, beginning **Monday morning, September 14**, at 9:15 a.m. We will be using the DVD series *Matthew: The King and His Kingdom* produced by Ascension Press and narrated by Jeff Cavins. This study brings the history of Christ to life through Matthew's Gospel. We will see Jesus as the awaited Messiah who fulfills the promises and prophecies of the Hebrew Scriptures, establishes the New Law, and inaugurates the Kingdom of Heaven. There will be twenty-four sessions in which we will view the DVD and participate in discussion. A study binder with background and discussion questions for each session will be available for \$30.00.

We will meet in the Ministry Center Library at 9:15 a.m. (following the 8:30 Mass), on **Monday September 14**, and continue every Monday morning except holidays. ## What was Happening in the Third Century?

Although Jesus himself was from a rural area of Galilee, Christianity grew primarily in an urban environment, as the Apostles and the first generations of missionary Christians that followed traveled to the larger and well populated cities. In fact, originally the word "pagan" simply meant someone from the countryside. As most people living in the countryside in the Roman Empire outside of Palestine were not Jewish or Christian, the term evolved to mean people who did not believe in monotheism, the worship of one God,

as the Jews and Christians did.

For some people the busyness and temptations of city life seemed a contradiction to the Christian calling, and to avoid this, some men and women began to move to wilderness places where they could focus their time and thoughts entirely upon God without the distractions caused by city life. They called themselves hermits, which meant those who live alone. Usually they lived in isolated areas, sometimes taking shelter in caves and living meagerly on what food they could produce themselves, or receiving gifts of food from people who sought them out for spiritual advice. They owned few possessions, perhaps a walking stick, one or two sets of clothing, a mat for sleeping, a bowl from which to eat, and if they were literate, a Bible. Bathing and changing clothes was not very important to them.

The phenomenon of eremiticism had existed even among the devotees of the Greek gods, among some Jews, and had been observed within Christian believers since perhaps the first century, but it was unorganized, sporadic and generally the hermits would live in isolation on the outskirts of a city rather than completely in the wilderness.

The earliest Christian hermit to provide some structure to this lifestyle was St. Anthony of Egypt, sometimes called Anthony of the Desert, or Anthony the Anchorite. Anthony was born to wealthy parents in Heracleopolis Magna, near the Nile Delta, in Egypt in 251 AD. His parents died when he was around eighteen years old, and as the only son, he inherited their lands and wealth, but moved by Jesus' command to the "Rich Young Man" of scripture, Anthony sold the lands and goods of his parents, gave the money to the poor, and went off into the desert to follow Jesus. He placed his younger sister in the care of some Christian Virgins.

For the first five years, Anthony lived with another hermit, but in his early twenties he went deeper into the desert where he took up residence in a tomb. It was there that St. Anthony experienced great temptations. His temptations came in the form of visions of evil spirits, of wild animals attacking him, and of desires for food and physical intimacy. He would defeat these temptations by prayer and penance. The stories of Anthony's temptations have inspired some great artistic achievements in western art by such artists as Michelangelo, Hieronymus Bosch, Salvador Dali and many others. The artistic representations of the temptations are bizarre and are probably more metaphorical than actual.

Although Anthony desired the solitude of the eremitic lifestyle, he was not always alone. People hearing about him would make pilgrimages to his hermitage to ask for spiritual advice. Other young men, wanting to follow his example established hermit dwellings nearby him. By example, though not in writing, he created a simple rule of life for hermits, which included prayer and manual labor. He is known as the Father of Monasticism.

St. Anthony sometimes traveled away from his hermitage as well. At least two trips were made to Alexandria. One in hope of becoming a martyr under the reign and persecutions of Diocletian. He was not martyred. Again he visited Alexandria to preach against the heresy of Arianism which was dividing the church. The Patriarch of Alexandria, Athanasius, wrote a biography of Anthony called *The Life of St. Anthony*. It is the first known biography to be written about a Christian.

And, so, the story of the Church continues . . .

### Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios

#### Vigésimo Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Quizás hayas visto la película *El discurso del Rey* (título original: *The King's Speech*), que trata sobre Jorge VI, el futuro rey de Inglaterra, cuyos trastornos del habla eran tan severos que lo hacían llorar de ira y humillación. Su esposa Isabel encontró un logopeda que fue capaz de ayudarlo usando algunos métodos heterodoxos, tales como dar vueltas sobre el piso, maldecir y cantar. Es un momento profundamente conmovedor cuando el rey Jorge se dirige por fin a su pueblo a través de la radio y da un discurso impecable dándole a su pueblo ánimo en la víspera de la Segunda Guerra Mundial.

La historia en este Evangelio nos cuenta cómo Jesús ayudó a un hombre a encontrar su propia voz. El hombre a quien Jesús había tocado con su saliva (un elemento al cual se le daba la propiedad de espantar los demonios) comenzó a hablar "correctamente". "Ábrete", dice Jesús, y así sucede (Marcos 7:34). Entonces el hombre habló la verdad sobre lo que Jesús había hecho por él y ensalzó a Jesús por ello.

Al afincarnos en nuestra fe en el Señor, Jesús nos pide tanto hablar como a actuar "correctamente" a los ojos del mundo preocupándonos por aquellos que tienen poco y tratándolos con la misma dignidad que el mundo le concede a aquellos que tienen mucho. Estamos llamados a imitar a Jesús con nuestra tierna atención a aquellos que han sido heridos por la vida y están abrumados por el rechazo de otras personas. Ayudar a los demás para que escuchen la melodía del amor se puede hacer de muchas maneras sencillas sin necesidad de mucha algarabía.
