The Greatest Feast

Easter is a big deal—a very big deal. Every one of the four Gospels provides

an account of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, which makes perfect sense because the bodily resurrection of Jesus has always been the foundation of the Christian faith from the very beginning. It is an ancient tradition, based on the evidence of scripture and on the writings of the early church, that Jesus celebrated the Last Supper on a Thursday, died on a Friday, and rose from the dead on a Sunday. Thus, today's Gospel tells us that Jesus rose from the dead on "the first day of the week" (John 20:1). Within about a hundred years of Jesus' resurrection Christians were celebrating the great Easter Vigil, beginning after dark on Holy Saturday and continuing until dawn on Easter morning. During this vigil, Christians heard salvation history through scripture readings, celebrated the resurrection of Jesus, and looked forward to his return. At the vigil men and women who had gone through three years of instruction were baptized and received First Communion. Without his death and rising to new life Jesus would have been merely another Jewish teacher and failed messiah. His teachings would be just a code of ethics and our worship in vain. We celebrate the Resurrection for fifty days, and for the rest of the year every Sunday is a kind of "mini-Easter." Easter is the culmination of Christ's life, death, and resurrection that we celebrate "with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth" (1 Corinthians 5:8). If you have not been to church for a while, we invite you to come back again and know that you are welcome in the community of faith. Please speak to the priest after Mass or call the parish office and let us help you feel at home.

Especially I am grateful for those who have served faithfully on the various ministry teams for RCIA children and adults, Infant Baptism, Adult Confirmation, and Bible studies. A special thanks in memorium to Lynda Schulte who helped with everything, whenever she could.

I am grateful for those who have shared their stories of faith with me through the R.C.I.A. process, and for those who have trusted me enough to talk about their broken dreams as we worked together through the annulment process. It is in you that I see God's grace at work.

I am grateful for the fine priests who have pastored or assisted at St. Norbert during my time here, their encouragement, their wisdom, their laughter, and sometimes their patience.

I am grateful for those who have regularly attended my Bible Studies and on-going Adult Discussion groups. Over the years we have formed a bond which I will truly miss.

Although I choose to retire from full time commitment, I will retain my connection with the Diocese of Orange by continuing as a faculty member of the Institute for Pastoral Ministries, where I will be periodically teaching formation classes for Deacons and Catechists. I also hope to be available to parishes in the Diocese for retreats, Bible Studies, or presentations. And I plan to give some time at the Diocesan Tribunal as an advocate for annulment cases. Beyond that, I plan to sit on my front porch and read lots and lots of books.

What Was Happening in the Thirteenth Century?

The other students teased the introverted and overweight boy who rarely spoke. They called him the Dumb Ox. Later, his Professor Albert the Great, would say "The bellowing of this ox will be heard around the world." Albert was correct. Thomas Aquinas would become one of the most famous theologians of the Catholic Church and would be quoted throughout the centuries in every place where Catholic doctrine is taught, discussed, or pondered. He would go from being called the Dumb Ox, to being called the Angelic Doctor.

Thomas was born in 1225 in a Sicilian castle to Landulf of Aquino, a knight. His mother, Theodora was from a noble Neapolitan family. Although both families were engaged in the military, Thomas' paternal uncle was the Abbot of the Benedictine Abbey of Monte Casino. Thomas was expected to follow in his uncles footsteps and choose vowed religious life as a Benedictine. The family sent

Thomas at the age of 5 to the Abbey to begin his education.

However, after a conflict between Emperor Frederick II and Pope Gregory IX affected the peace and stability of the monastery, Thomas was withdrawn and admitted to the University in Naples. At this university, Thomas was introduced to the philosophy of Aristotle, Averroes, and Maimonides, all of which would have great influence on Thomas' work. There, also, he became a follower of John of St. Julian, a Dominican who preached in Naples.

At nineteen, Thomas decided to join the Dominicans. His family was not pleased by his apparent abandonment of their Benedictine plans for him. So determined were they, that as Thomas traveled to join the Dominicans in Rome, two of his military brothers captured him, and returned him to the family castle. There he was kept as a prisoner for nearly a year. The family tried every means to dissuade him from becoming a Dominican, which to their thinking was too new a movement and not entirely respectable. However, Thomas persevered in his determination and in 1244 escaped through a window and headed back to Rome where he met the Master General of the Dominicans.

The following year, Thomas was sent to the University of Paris where he studied under Albert Magus. When Albert was transferred to Cologne in 1248, Thomas went with him. In Cologne, Thomas taught scripture and wrote several commentaries on books of the Old Testament. Pope Innocent IV offered to appoint Thomas as Abbot of Monte Cassino, even though he had taken vows as a Dominican, but Thomas refused. In 1252, Thomas returned to Paris where he worked toward a Master's Degree in Theology, and continued to teaching. He applied his final years of study toward his Master's degree to Peter Lombard's *Sentences*, on which he wrote an extensive commentary. He was appointed as Regent Master of Theology at Paris University in 1256, a position he would hold for three years and during which he would write numerous works of theology and philosophy.

In 1259, he left his post in Paris, and returned to Naples, then on to Orvieto where he was responsible for the formation of Dominican friars, and continued his tremendous output of writing. He composed liturgical texts for Pope IV, which included hymns still sung today such as *Tantum Ergo* and the soaring *Panis Angelicus*.

Pope Clement IV summoned Thomas to come to Rome in 1265 to serve as Papal Theologian. At the same time, the Dominican Provincial assigned him to teach at the Dominican School of Santa Sabrina in Rome. At Santa Sabrina, Thomas would begin his famous nine-volume work *Summa Theologiae*, which he considered to be a text for beginners.

He was called back to Paris in 1269 for a second regency at the University of Paris. His second term in this office was far more troubled due to various conflicts and accusations of heresy within the university. He continued working on the *Summa*. In 1274, Thomas was summoned by Pope Gregory X to attend the Second Council of Lyons, at which one of Thomas' books was to be presented. The council was scheduled to begin on May 1, 1274. Riding his horse to Lyons, Thomas struck his head on a tree branch and was injured. He died on March 7, 1274 at 48 years of age. The *Summa Theologiae*, with nine volumes completed, was never finished.

La Pascua es algo grande—algo *mu*y grande. Los cuatro Evangelios nos ofrecen un relato de la resurrección

de Jesucristo, lo cual tiene mucho sentido, pues la resurrección de Jesús ha sido siempre el fundamento de la fe cristiana desde sus comienzos. La tradición antigua basada en las Escrituras y en los escritos de la Iglesia primitiva dice que Jesús celebró la Última Cena un jueves, murió un viernes y resucitó un domingo. Por tanto, el Evangelio de hoy nos dice que Jesús resucitó “el primer día después del sábado” (Juan 20:1). Antes de que se cumplieran cien años de la resurrección de Jesús los cristianos celebraban ya la gran Vigilia Pascual que comenzaba en la noche del Sábado Santo y continuaba hasta el alba del día siguiente. Durante esta vigilia los cristianos escuchaban la historia de la salvación en la lectura de las Escrituras, celebraban la resurrección de Jesús y esperaban su regreso. Los hombres y las mujeres que habían pasado por tres años de instrucción recibían el Bautismo y la Primera Comunión durante esta vigilia. Sin su muerte y resurrección Jesús hubiese sido un rabino más y un mesías fracasado. Sus enseñanzas hubieran sido sólo un código ético y nuestro culto sería en vano. La Resurrección se celebra durante cincuenta días, lo cual se conoce como la Cincuentena Pascual, y cada domingo del año conmemoramos el misterio pascual. La Pascua es la culminación de la vida, muerte y resurrección de Cristo que celebramos “con el pan sin levadura, que es de sinceridad y verdad” (1 Corintios 5:8). Si hace tiempo que no vas a la iglesia, te invitamos a que vuelvas y te recibiremos con los brazos abiertos en la comunidad de fe. Por favor habla con el sacerdote después de la Misa o llama a la oficina parroquial y dinos cómo podemos hacerte sentir bien en casa.

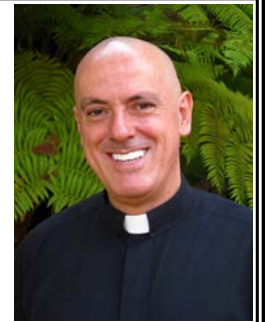
Descanse en Paz, Padre Agustín
