Reflecting on God's Word

Sue loves to iron clothes. In the process, she says, she also irons out her life, all its wrinkles and creases. She says she can stand neither her clothes nor her life when they're all rumped. John runs every day. A lot of folks do. He hasn't missed a day in five years. But it's also where he and they pace out the rhythms of their lives. More than one frazzled mother has locked herself in the bathroom for twenty minutes of solitude and quasi-peace. Sometimes deserts look like bathrooms. Even teenagers know the need, so they crank up some tunes, stretch out on their beds, and listen beyond the music to the melodies played upon their lives.

I suspect there is a lot going on in those spaces. That's where kids get raised and loves get sorted and businesses are merged and decisions unraveled and re-raveled. But somewhere in the midst of it all we also make some decisions about who and what we want to become in this life—at any age. That's where goodness has a chance to surface and values are affirmed and commitments are remade for the umpteenth time and faith sprouts forth. And then it becomes prayer, out of the silence and the stillness and the darkness of time spent alone.

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Dear Friends in Christ,

Since Lent comes quite early this year, the diocese of Orange has provided a statement on fasting, abstinence and exceptions. Please note that you need NO special dispensation if you are unable to observe these disciplines on the prescribed days for “sufficiently good reason” (see below). While the notice specifically mentions the Lunar New Year, the proverbial elephant in the room for most of us will be Ash Wednesday, which happens to fall on February 14 this year. While I assume that the same principles would apply, I would recommend that all who are obliged to do so to keep the fast and abstinence from meat. However, if you find yourself unable to avoid eating meat on that day, simply find another day to observe these Lenten disciplines.

One of the ironies about Ash Wednesday is, of course, that although it is not (nor has it ever been) a Holy Day of Obligation, more people show up on this day than on most of the obligatory feasts. Receiving ashes on the forehead is highly recommended, but not required, so if you do come to Mass that day, be advised that we distribute them right after the homily. And no, we won't be making heart shapes...crosses only, as usual.

Here is the statement from Bishop Vann's office:

Dispensation and the Lenten Fast

The Lenten season calls all faithful Catholics to remember in heart and mind the redemptive self-sacrifice of Jesus for the life of the world. From the earliest days of our faith, Christians have been called to special penance and sacrifice during not only the 40 days of Lent but especially on the significant days of the Lenten liturgical season, Ash Wednesday, Good Friday as well as all the Fridays of Lent. In light of this, all Catholics in the United States are encouraged to enter into sacrificial penance during these days and, specifically, to refrain from the eating of meat on all the Fridays of Lent, with the added penance of holy fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. While this discipline of penance and fasting is serious, it no longer binds one under pain of grave sin. For a sufficiently good reason (e.g., a special family celebration, an ethnic festival, Lunar New Year, etc.), one may dispense oneself from this serious obligation and may legitimately substitute another day of the week to fulfill this penance. It is for this reason, that there is no need for a specific “dispensation” from the Bishop, lifting the penance for these days.

Flu Season Guidelines and the Liturgy

With the arrival of cold and flu season, concerns naturally are raised about health and well-being. Common sense and basic hygiene is the best way to limit the spread of flu and colds. The following guidelines from Diocese of Orange Office for Worship will also be helpful.

In Christian charity, stay home when sick. It is not a sin to miss Mass because you are sick or taking care of someone who is sick. Stay home and return to Church when you are well.

During the Sign of Peace, if a person is feeling ill, has flu-like symptoms, or simply does not want to shake hands, he or she can make a simpler gesture such as a smile or a bow of the head with the words "The peace of the Lord be with you" to show the mutual charity celebrated in this part of the liturgy.

It is an individual's decision whether or not to receive the Body and Blood of Christ under both species. Christ is truly and completely present under each of the sacramental signs of either bread or wine. While the fullness of the sacramental sign of Eucharistic communion is exemplified when both the sacramental signs of bread and wine are received, you are not obligated to receive from the cup. If someone is gluten intolerant, receiving from the Cup allows them to receive Holy Communion.

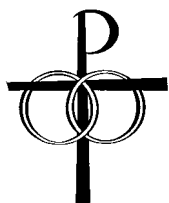
Priests, Altar Servers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should always wash their hands before and after Mass. If alcohol-based anti-bacterial solution is used, avoid waving your hands to dry them, especially when standing near the altar.

While the faithful in the United States may receive the Eucharistic bread either on the tongue or in the hand, those accustomed to receiving on the tongue might (strongly) consider, during the cold and flu season, receiving in the hand to avoid the possible contact with saliva.

In distributing the sacred host, carefully avoid direct contact between your fingers and the hand or tongue of the communicant (this may require some practice).

If you are distributing Holy Communion from the Chalice, be sure to wipe both inside and outside of the rim after each communicant (use thumb and forefinger through the purificator to "press" against both sides). Then turn the cup a bit for the next communicant. Also, remember to keep shifting the purificator so that you are not wiping with the same part of the cloth over and over again.

After the ritual cleansing of the chalices, they should be carefully cleaned with anti-bacterial soap and warm water, and then dried with clean towels (or fresh purificators). They should then be covered for use at the next Mass.

Estimados amigos en Cristo,

Dado que la Cuaresma llegará bastante temprano este año, la Diócesis de Orange ha proporcionado una declaración sobre el ayuno, abstinencia, y excepciones. Por favor tengan en cuenta que NO necesitan ninguna dispensa especial si no pueden observar estas disciplinas en los días prescritos como "razón suficientemente buena" (ver a continuación).

Mientras el aviso menciona específicamente el Año Nuevo Lunar, el problema para la mayoría de nosotros será el Miércoles de Ceniza, que este año cae el 14 de febrero. Si bien supongo que se aplicarán los mismos principios, recomendaría que todos los que están obligados a hacerlo lo hagan para mantener el ayuno y la abstinencia de carne. Sin embargo, si no pueden evitar comer carne en ese día, simplemente busquen otro día para observar estas disciplinas de Cuaresma.

Una de las ironías sobre el Miércoles de Ceniza, es que aunque no es (ni ha sido) un día sagrado de obligación, es cuando más personas llegan este día que en la mayoría de las festividades obligatorias. Recibir cenizas en la frente es muy recomendable, pero no obligatorio, así que si acuden a Misa ese día, tengan en cuenta que distribuiremos la ceniza inmediatamente después de la homilía. Y no, no lo haremos en forma de corazón... sólo cruces, como de costumbre.

Aquí la declaración de la oficina del Obispo Vann:

Dispensa y ayuno durante la Cuaresma

La temporada de Cuaresma llama a todos los fieles católicos a recordar en corazón y mente el sacrificio auto redentor de Jesús por la vida del mundo. Desde los primeros días de nuestra fe, los cristianos han sido llamados a una especial penitencia y sacrificio no sólo durante los 40 días de Cuaresma, sino especialmente en los días significativos de la temporada de Cuaresma: Miércoles de Ceniza, Viernes Santo y todos los viernes de Cuaresma. A la luz de esto, se anima a todos los católicos en los Estados Unidos a entrar en penitencia y sacrificio durante estos días y, específicamente, a abstenerse de comer carne todos los viernes de Cuaresma, con la penitencia añadida de ayuno santo el Miércoles de Ceniza y Viernes Santo. Si bien, esta disciplina de penitencia y ayuno es seria, ya no obliga a uno bajo pena de pecado grave. Por una razón suficientemente buena (por ejemplo, una celebración familiar especial, una fiesta étnica, el Año Nuevo Lunar, etc.), uno puede prescindir de esta obligación seria y puede legítimamente sustituir otro día de la semana para cumplir con esta penitencia. Es por esta razón, que no hay necesidad de una 'dispensa' específica del Obispo, de levantar la penitencia para estos días.

Lineamientos para la Liturgia y la Temporada de Gripe

Durante esta temporada de resfriados y gripe, naturalmente han aumentado las preocupaciones de salubridad y bienestar. El sentido común y la higiene básica es la mejor manera de limitar la propagación de la gripe y los resfriados. Los siguientes lineamientos de la Oficina de Culto de la Diócesis de Orange, también serán de ayuda.

Es una caridad cristiana el quedarse en casa cuando uno esté enfermo. No es pecado el no ir a misa porque está enfermo o porque está cuidando de alguien enfermo. Quédese en casa y vuelva a la Iglesia cuando ya se haya recuperado.

Durante la señal de la paz, si una persona se siente enfermo/a (tiene síntomas similares a la gripe) o simplemente no quiere dar la mano, él o ella puede sonreír o inclinar la cabeza y al mismo tiempo decir "La paz" y así demostrar la caridad mutua que se celebra durante esta parte de la liturgia.

La decisión de recibir el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo bajo las dos especies, es individual. Cristo está verdaderamente y completamente presente en cada uno de los signos sacramentales, ya sea en el pan o en el vino. Mientras que la plenitud del signo sacramental de la comunión eucarística se ejemplifica cuando se reciben los dos signos sacramentales del pan y del vino, usted no está obligado a recibir del cáliz. Si alguna persona tiene intolerancia al gluten, el recibir del cáliz le permite recibir la sagrada comunión.

Los sacerdotes, monaguillos y ministros extraordinarios de la sagrada comunión siempre deben lavarse las manos antes y después de la Misa. Si se utiliza una solución antibacteriana a base de alcohol, evite agitar sus manos para secarlas, especialmente al estar cerca del altar.

Aunque los fieles en los Estados Unidos pueden recibir el pan eucarístico ya sea en la lengua o en la mano, quienes están acostumbrados a recibir en la lengua podrían considerar (seriamente), durante la temporada de resfriados y gripe, recibir en la mano para evitar el posible contacto con la saliva.

En la distribución de la sagrada hostia, evite cuidadosamente el contacto directo entre sus dedos y la mano o la lengua del comulgante. Esto puede requerir un poco de práctica.

Si va a distribuir la sagrada comunión por medio del cáliz, asegúrese de limpiar por dentro y por fuera del borde del cáliz después de cada comulgante (coloque el purificador entre su pulgar e índice de manera que al presionar el purificador entre sus dedos, pueda limpiar por dentro y por fuera del borde del cáliz). A continuación, gire el cáliz un poco para el próximo comulgante. También, recuerde que debe deslizar el purificador para que no se limpie con la misma parte de la tela una y otra vez.

Después de la limpieza ritual de los cálices, estos deben ser limpiados cuidadosamente con jabón antibacteriano y agua tibia, y luego se deben secar con toallas limpias (o purificadores limpios). Después deben ser cubiertos para su uso en la próxima Misa.
