

Building Up the Church

The Church of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of Rome, and hence the mother church of the entire world. It was built on land owned by the Lateran family and was dedicated to St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist. It dates to the fourth century, and it is the oldest church in Rome.

The anniversary for the dedication of this cathedral is November 9. Whenever that day falls on a Sunday, a special Mass is held in every Catholic Church around the world. Your parish church is a symbol of your local community. Your cathedral church is a symbol of your diocesan community. And St. John Lateran symbolizes the universal community, the Body of Christ.


In a letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul says we are God's building. "Like a wise master builder I laid a foundation," Paul tells them, "and another is building upon it." The foundation, he says, is Jesus Christ.

Paul imagines us as layers of brickwork in a rising building. Jesus is the sure foundation, and we each do our part to rest squarely upon him and his gospel. Then the church will continue to rise strong in service, in unity, and in praise of God.

We use the word "church" to describe a building and a people. Today we celebrate the church in both senses of the word. Let us rejoice in the faith we share, and do our part to build higher upon the strong foundation of Jesus Christ.

Bible Studies

It is a time to meet with others in quiet and peace away from the busyness and noise of the world. We gather for prayer in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel at 7:30 p.m.

Wondering Why

We might find today's feast day to be an odd one. Each year on November 9, the Church celebrates the Dedication of the St. John Lateran Basilica in Rome. Since the 9th falls on a Sunday only every 5 years or so, it often passes by without much notice for the majority of Catholics. It's odd because most Solemnities and Feasts celebrate people, Jesus, Mary, one of the Saints, or events, Christmas, Easter, Pentecost; but this day celebrates a building. This particular building is important because it is the principle papal church in Rome. St. John's Lateran is the church of the pope, the Bishop of Rome. It is one of four patriarchal basilicas, the others being St. Peter's on Vatican Hill, St. Paul Outside the Walls, and St. Mary Major. St. John Lateran was dedicated in the early 4th century on land said to be donated by Constantine, which previously was the site of the palace of the Laterani, a noble family of Rome. This church complex contained the official living

quarters of the Popes from the fourth through the fourteenth centuries. During that time it was damaged many times by earthquakes and by barbarian attacks. In 905 it was rebuilt and dedicated to St. John the Baptist. Although most ceremonial events are held at St. Peter's Basilica, St. John's Lateran remains the official church of the Bishop of Rome.

Although we know that God is present everywhere, sacred buildings have evolved in almost every religion as a place set apart to remember the presence of God. David understood this in the Book of Samuel when he spoke of his desire to build a Temple to God. David never realized this ambition in his own lifetime, but his son Solomon erected a great Temple in the City of Jerusalem which was completed and dedicated in around 950 BC. This Temple in Jerusalem was the center of Jewish worship until it was destroyed by the Babylonians in 586 BC. Today's first reading from Ezekiel, written during the Babylonian exile (586 – 535 BC) prophesies about a new temple that God will give to his people. In 535 King Cyrus of Persia conquered Babylon and gave permission to the Jewish people to return to their homeland providing funds to rebuild the Temple. A new, but smaller, temple was built and dedicated in 515 BC. Herod the Great expanded the Temple complex in the decades before Jesus was born, and it was this expanded Temple of Herod which is the site of the Gospel passage from John.

In this passage from John, Jesus is angry because the holiness of the Temple has been debased by money changers who cheated people as they changed their Roman coins to Jewish ones in order to purchase animals for sacrifice. Jesus knew that the Temple should be a place of prayer, not a place of business transactions, especially dishonest ones. After forcibly disrupting the activities of the money changers, Jesus makes a claim that no one in the story seems to understand. Jesus says, "Destroy this Temple and in three days I will raise it up." The people thought he meant the building, and found the claim ridiculous; but Jesus meant himself. If they destroyed the Temple of his body, he would be raised up in three days. Jesus himself replaces the Temple, and after his enemies tried to destroy him by death, he did in fact rise up again in three days.

The actual Temple of Jerusalem, however, was completely destroyed in 70 AD by the Romans in response to a Jewish revolt. It has never been rebuilt, and all that remains today is a portion of its Western foundation wall.

Buildings can be impressive, and religious people enjoy having them; but the real Church is not the building, but the Body of Christ. Christ continues to be present in his people who, according to St. Paul, are Christ's living body on earth. So, whether the building is a grand basilica in Rome or a tiny mission hut in Africa, it is the people who make it a church because in them the Body of Christ is present with Jesus as their head.

Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios

No somos lo que quisiéramos ser. Eso lo sabemos muy bien. Los siete pecados capitales no son fantasías. Nosotros los personificamos bien: ira y soberbia, avaricia y lujuria, gula, envidia y pereza. Nuestro espíritu lleva consigo la marca de Caín.

También es cierto que a menudo queremos que los demás sean como nosotros no podemos ser y por eso buscamos a la Iglesia como guía; pero la Iglesia somos nosotros y si nosotros somos pecadores también la Iglesia lo es. Nuestra historia como comunidad de creyentes lo dice todo y muy claramente. Libramos una guerra contra las Cruzadas. Nos rebelamos para alcanzar el poder gubernamental y civil. Nos volvimos intolerables durante la Inquisición. Fuimos un almacén de riquezas. Y más recientemente fuimos demasiado arrogantes para admitir los abusos sexuales que estaban ocurriendo en medio nuestro.

Si somos el templo de Dios, un templo hecho de piedras vivas, entonces también necesitamos que se nos limpie igual que Jesús una vez limpió el templo de su época. Nosotros reconocemos esta necesidad. Lo bueno es que la Iglesia también se limpia en cada generación, porque el pecado se cuele en todas las épocas. Y así también la Iglesia, ese templo vivo, se va haciendo nueva constantemente, aunque el proceso sea doloroso.

Sería maravilloso si la Iglesia fuera todo lo que profesa el Evangelio. El hecho de que no sea así, puede desilusionar, pero el reino de Dios no ha llegado todavía, no del todo. Mientras tanto el Señor Jesús continúa limpiándonos y renovándonos. Y lo maravilloso es que el río que fluye de ese templo de piedras vivas todavía da vida a todo lo que toca, a pesar de nuestro pecado.


