### The Devil's Traps

Search for pictures of the devil or Satan and you will see images of a

snarling face, long gnarled horns, hooves dripping with blood, red skin, and a tail. But those who tempt us to do evil are not at all like these pictures; many of them smile sweetly and have excellent social skills. The snake in the Garden of Eden was not frightening or threatening; he just talked very persuasively, and once Adam and Eve listened to him and ate the forbidden fruit they knew their world was turned upside down. After Jesus' baptism in the Jordan, the same smooth talker who brought catastrophe on Adam and Eve tried his wiles on Jesus. He tried three powerful tests. Jesus rejected them all and the Tempter left, unable to turn Jesus' heart away from God. The invitation to do evil is perpetually present, so that all of us face versions of each temptation faced by Jesus. And it's never a matter of simply breaking the rules. Where the Evil One gets a real foothold is when something becomes a sinful habit, a persistent thread in our lives, especially if we fail to recognize the harm it is doing to us and others. The harsh words shouted once in anger and regretted are less damaging than a persistent habit of belittling people. Breaking one's marriage vow and being deeply repentant is not like a pattern of cheating over many years. The Church, with the wisdom of generations of experience, provides Lent, this annual season of spiritual "spring cleaning." If it has been a while since you went to confession, consider it now. If you go to the sacrament and confess the same sins over and over, ask yourself why. God forgives not just once, but for always.

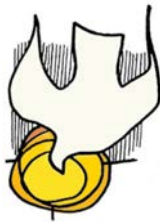
## Fish Fry

This DVD series was presented last year in our Monday morning sessions and was enjoyed by the parishioners who attended. Join us for evening presentations beginning on **Wednesday, March 8**, from 7:30 to 9 p.m. We will learn the Biblical background to the words, prayers and gestures of the Mass, explore the aspects of the Mass as Sacrifice, Real Presence, and Holy Communion, and gain insights on applying the liturgy to our life experiences. ## What Was Happening in the Twelfth Century?

Although the controversy over lay investiture had been resolved in Italy and most of Europe, it continued in England until the early twelfth century. The British Bishops remained faithful to King Henry I, who ignored papal directives and continued to appoint and invest clerics to their offices, despite threats of excommunication from Rome.

Anselm, the Archbishop of Canterbury tried to mediate between Henry I and Rome, but failed and found refuge in a monastery. The King's chief advisor, Robert of Meulan was excommunicated but the pope did not follow through on threats to the king, as England was still needed by the Church to support the prospective crusade

In 1107 a concordant was called in London to find a solution of the conflict between Henry I and the Church. In a compromise solution, Henry gave up the right for appointment and investiture of the British Bishops and Abbots, but retained a commendation ceremony following, in which the cleric declared homage to the king for the property connected to his office, and pledged himself as vassal to the king under the feudal laws. It also defined the

areas of civil law which would be under the governance of the king and his appointees rather than under the rule of the bishop. Anselm was near the end of his life when the Concordant of London was approved, but his work had helped to make it possible.

Anselm was a philosopher and theologian before he became politically involved in the Investiture Controversy. He is considered the father of the Scholastic Period of theological inquiry, a more academic approach to theology dependent upon logic and reason, which also included Pierre Abelard, Pierre Lombard, and Thomas Aquinas. Anselm had attempted to join a monastery at age fifteen, but failing to obtain his father's approval, was not accepted by the abbot. At age twenty-seven, he again presented himself, and was received as a novice at the Monastery at Bec. During his first year at Bec, he wrote his first treatise on philosophical paradoxes which was titled, *Grammairian*. In 1063, the Prior of Bec, Lanfranc, was sent to serve as Abbot of the new monastery of St. Stephen at Caen, and the monks of Bec elected Anselm as his replacement. His abilities in the formation of monks in religious life was outstanding and superiors from other monasteries were known to come to Anselm for advice. After fifteen years as prior, upon the death of the abbey's founder, Herluin, Anselm was unanimously elected as the Abbot of Bec.

Under Anselm's influence, Bec became one of the leading centers of education in Europe, attracting students from many countries. During this time he wrote several more philosophical works, including one on the Trinity, the nature of free will, and the fall of Satan.

After the death of Lanfranc, who was by then Bishop of Canterbury, King William II, left the archbishopric empty for four years, while he enjoyed the income from its properties. In March of 1093, William nominated Anselm to replace Lanfranc, and the Bishops elected him, much to Anselm's own opposition on the grounds of poor health. The following August, Anselm gave William the grounds on which he would accept the archbishopric, which included the release and return of all property that had been seized by the crown, the king must pledge his support of Pope Urban II and not of the antipope Clement III, and that the king must accept spiritual counsel from Anselm. The king opposed these conditions, but under pressure from the other bishops and the populace he accepted them. Anselm was consecrated as Archbishop of Canterbury on September 25, 1093, and on the same day, King William returned the stolen lands to the Church.

King William was killed in a hunting accident in 1102, and was succeeded by Henry I. Anselm was exiled twice by this king for his involvement with the English Investiture Controversy, finally giving up the contest and moving into a monastery. He died in 1109, and was formally canonized by Pope Alexander VI in 1496, though he had been popularly acclaimed as a saint and venerated since 1163. Because of the volume and insight of his writings, in 1720 Pope Clement XI proclaimed Anselm a Doctor of the Church.

Después del bautismo de Jesús en el Jordán la misma charlatana sutil que causó una catástrofe para Adán y Eva, trató sus artimañas con Jesús. Trató tres pruebas poderosas, pero Jesús las rechazó todas y el tentador se fue, incapaz de alejar de Dios el corazón de Jesús. La invitación para hacer el mal está perpetuamente presente, de manera que todos nosotros nos enfrentamos con diferentes versiones de cada una de las tentaciones que Jesús enfrentó. Y nunca se trata sólo de romper unas reglas. El malvado se afianza cuando algo se convierte en un hábito pecaminoso y persistente en nuestra vida, sobre todo si no reconocemos el daño que nos está haciendo a nosotros mismos y a los demás. Unas palabras ásperas que se gritan por enojo y más tarde lamentamos son menos dañinas que el hábito persistente de subestimar a los demás. Romper nuestros votos matrimoniales y luego arrepentirse profundamente no es lo mismo que engañar habitualmente durante muchos años. La Iglesia, con la sabiduría y la experiencia de muchas generaciones, nos da la Cuaresma cada año como una oportunidad espiritual para hacer una "limpieza de primavera". Si hace tiempo que no has ido a confesarte, considéralo ahora. Si te acercas al sacramento y confiesas los mismos pecados una y otra vez, pregúntate por qué es así. Dios no perdona solamente una vez, sino para siempre.
